**Non-Regular/Unofficial Classes:** Available to both varieties

The following Non-regular and Unofficial classes will be offered. Any dog entered in these classes must also be entered in one of the regular classes or for Exhibition Only.

**Stud Dog & Get:** Stud Dog and two or more (up to four) of his get. Sire and get need not be owned by the same person. Stud Dog must be entered in a regular class or for Exhibition Only. (must be the same variety)

**Brood Bitch & Progeny:** Brood Bitch and two or more (up to four) of her progeny. Brood and progeny need not be owned by the same person. Brood Bitch must be entered in a regular class or for Exhibition Only. (must be the same variety)

**Brace:** This class shall be for 2 dogs of the same breed (not necessarily of the same sex). A brace must be handled by 1 person on 1 lead.

**Bred By Exhibitor in Specialty:** (from the Bred by Exhibitor or Specials only classes),

**Baby Puppy:** 4 – 6 months

**Sexually Altered Class:** This class is for dogs which have been spayed or neutered.

**Rosettes or Ribbons and/or Prizes are offered to:**

Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog, Select Bitch, Best Puppy, Best of Winners, Best Veteran, Winners Dog, Winners Bitch, Reserve Winners Dog, Reserve Winners Bitch, Best of Breed Altered, Best of Opposite Altered, Veteran Female, Veteran Male, all Unofficial classed, A Ribbon will be given to First – Fourth in each class. A trophy for Best Breeder/Owner/Handler

**Note: Award of Merit** – The Judge can present Award of Merits based on 1 for each 10 dogs entering the Breed ring. They must go to SD and/or SB first in whatever order the Judge chooses, prior to considering any of the other Breed ring entrants. Any additional Award of Merits will receive a rosette.

**Perpetual Trophies:**

Best Breeder/Owner/Handled for Short Coat Chihuahuas, donated by Hilaire Permanent Registered in memory of Can.Am.Ch. Hilaire's Cherie Scelle (Canada's Top Toy Dog 1983: Breed Record)

Best Breeder/Owner/Handled for Long Coat donated by Hilaire Permanent Registered.

These trophies will be retained by the club, with a keeper trophy awarded. Dog must be entered in either the Bred by Exhibitor class or Specials Only and must be handled in the ring by the Breeder/Owner.

## **Obedience:**

**Pre-Novice** – shall be for any dog which has not earned the title of P.C.D. (Pre-Companion Dog) in Canada. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person.

**Novice “A”** - The Novice A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title of CD. Only one dog per handler is allowed in this class, and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families, and must be eligible to handle under Section No person who has exhibited a dog that has earned a CDX title shall be allowed to handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled

**Novice “B”** - The Novice B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has not earned the title of CD. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all seven (7) exercises unless he has two (2) or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Novice A and Novice B class at any one trial.

**Novice “C”** - class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title CD or any higher obedience titles. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter more than one (1) dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all six (6) exercises unless he has two (2) or more dogs entered. In such cases, he must have an additional handler for each extra dog when they are judged together in the group exercises. Dogs may compete in the Novice C class indefinitely. Scores earned by dogs entered in the Novice C class are not eligible for High in Trial and do not qualify a dog for any title. Dogs may be entered in the Novice C class in addition to any other official or unofficial classes for which they are eligible

**Intermediate Novice** - as per Obedience Trial Rules & Regulation

**Open “A”** - The Open A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD but has not earned the title of CDX. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Only one (1) dog per handler is allowed in this class and that person must handle the dog in all exercises. Any person who has exhibited a dog that has earned an OTCH title may not handle a dog in this class. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.

**Open “B”** - The Open B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CD. Dogs that have earned the title of CDX or any higher obedience titles may enter in the Open B class. A dog may also be entered in the Utility class in the same trial. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. A person may enter or handle more than one (1) dog in this class. The same handler must handle each dog in all seven (7) exercises. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six (6) numbered routines is to be performed. These choices will not be disclosed to exhibitors until they are posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of each class and never more than one hour before the

start of the trial. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six (6) routines so they will be used approximately the same number of times.

**Utility “A”** – The Utility A class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CDX but has not earned the title of OTCH. Any person who has exhibited a dog that has earned a MOTCH title may not handle dogs in this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner or a member of their immediate families. Owners may enter more than one (1) dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. When a dog is wrongfully entered in this class, any score awarded will be cancelled.

**Utility “B”** – The Utility B class shall be for any dog of any recognized or listed breed, mixed breed or unrecognized breed that has earned the title of CDX or OTCH. Dogs in this class may be handled by the owner or any other person. Owners may enter more than one (1) dog in this class. The same person must handle the dog in all exercises. No dog may be entered in both the Utility A and Utility B classes at any one trial. Prior to the start of judging, the judge will choose which of the six (6) numbered routines will be performed. This choice will not be disclosed to exhibitors until it is posted at ring side at least 30 minutes before the start of the class and never more than one hour before the start of the trial. In future assignments, judges are required to alternate the six (6) routines so that each will be used approximately the same number of times.

### **Rally Obedience:**

**Rally Novice A:** Dogs competing in this class may not have earned the R. N. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

**Rally Novice B:** Any dog may compete in this class until a qualifying score in the Rally Advanced Class is earned. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged on leash, and all dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

**Rally Intermediate:** The Rally Intermediate Class is an elective class and earning the title is not a requirement to enter Rally Advanced Classes. (CKC rules, 10.1.2) This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.I. or any other obedience or rally titles may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. This class (performed on leash, no jumps, no A or B division) may be entered indefinitely. Judges would ordinarily use the same course for it as for their Advanced Classes, substituting one other exercise for the jump required in Advanced.

**Rally Advanced A:** This class shall be for dogs that have won the Rally Novice (R. N.) title but have not won the Rally Advanced (R. A.) title or any CKC Novice Obedience title. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. A dog may continue to compete in this class after the owner has been notified by at least 2 different judges that the dog has won 3 qualifying scores in this class. However, a dog may not be entered or exhibited in this class in any rally trial after the owner has received official notification from the CKC that the dog has won the title. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

**Rally Advanced B:** This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.N. title. A dog completing the R.A. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash. No dog may be entered in both Rally Advanced A and Rally Advanced B at any one trial.

**Rally Excellent A:** This class shall be for dogs that have earned the R. A. title, but have not earned the R. E. title or any CKC Obedience title other than P.C.D. No handler who has exhibited a dog through its CKC C.D.X. title shall be eligible to enter this class. The handler of any dog in this class must be the owner, co-owner, or a member of their immediate families. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. There is also a sit stay exercise after the finish sign. All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.

**Rally Excellent B:** This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.A. title. A dog completing the R.E. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class. All exercises are judged off leash. There is a sit stay exercise after the finish sign

**Rally Master:** This class will be for dogs that have earned the R.E. TITLE. A dog completing the R.M. title may continue to compete in this class indefinitely. The owner or any other person may handle dogs in this class. A person may enter more than one dog in this class.

- Rally Ring size will be 45' x 60'
- The precincts of these trials are the ring and the immediate surrounding area.
- All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash.
- No dog may be entered in both Rally Excellent A and Rally Excellent B at any one trial.
- No handler who has exhibited a dog through its C.K.C. Obedience CDX title shall be eligible to enter the 'A' class in Rally Novice, Advanced or Excellent.
- Only dogs entered are permitted within the precincts of the trial.

**Obedience / Rally-O Awards:** Ribbons will be given to the First to Fourth in each class. HIT Obedience and HQS (unofficial) for Rally-O Rosettes and/or prizes.

**Sweepstakes:** (divided by sex) Classes

Juvenile: 6-9 months / 9-12 months / 12-18 months

Veteran: 7-9 years / 9 years and older

Prizes (Juvenile & Veteran) 1<sup>st</sup> place 30%, 2<sup>nd</sup> place 20%, 3<sup>rd</sup> place 15%, 4<sup>th</sup> place 10% for each class. Rosette will be awarded for Best in Sweepstakes, Best of Opposite Sex and 1<sup>st</sup> through 4<sup>th</sup> in each class. 25% will be retained for Administration.

**Attention US Exhibitors:** Current exchange rate favours the American dollar. To take full advantage of this, please purchase bank drafts or money orders payable in Canadian funds. Personal cheques will be accepted; however, they must be payable in US funds, and for the full amount of the entry. Please do not mark personal cheques payable in Canadian fund, or "at par" as such items are not readily cleared through the bank. Your cooperation is appreciated.

**ATTENTION: ALL FOREIGN EXHIBITORS - ERN NUMBERS** All dogs that are foreign born and foreign owned and enter Canada for the sole purpose of entering CKC events no longer require a CKC registration number but will require an event registration number (ERN). This ERN number does not register a dog with the CKC for breeding purposes as defined in the Animal Pedigree Act, but rather enables a foreign owned dog to be awarded titles by the CKC. Each dog must have its own number. To obtain an ERN number, mail or fax a photocopy of the dog's foreign registration certificate with a cheque or VISA/Mastercard number, (expiry date, cardholders name and signature). Provide your complete address for return of ERN number. ERN number must be applied for within 30 DAYS of the FIRST day of entering a CKC event.

**Temporary Competition Numbers or (TCN)** – A TCN must be obtained before submitting an entry for an event and the same TCN must be used for all event entries for a dog until the dog is permanently registered or has an ERN, the TCN will be replaced with the registration number or ERN. A TCN cannot be used for Listed Breeds (MCN) or dogs that will require a (Performance Event Number) PEN or (Canine Companion Number) CCN.

While there is no fee to obtain a TCN, exhibitors will still be required to pay TCN fees (formerly called listing fees) when entering events using this number.

The process of obtaining a TCN will be self serve; exhibitors will be directed to the CKC website to complete an online application and a TCN will be issued instantly upon completion.

Exhibitors may also obtain a TCN by completing a printed application and submitting it to the CKC by mail, or by contacting the Shows and Trials Division by telephone.

Please note that if your dog does not have a registration number or ERN, and has already competed in a CKC event and earned points, score, or awards, there is no need to apply for a TCN. CKC records will be updated accordingly.

## **Day Tenting**

A space will be provided for day tents in designated areas only. **Tents cannot have bottoms on them and no grass mats on the field.** Please see the day tenting attendant before setting up your tent.

We will have reserved day tenting at a cost of \$25.00 for a 10 x 10 space, maximum of 85 spaces.

**NO** generators will be allowed in the reserved day tenting. There will still be free day tenting around the fence line (outer edge of the field), generators can be used here but must have protection so they do not burn the grass. There will be handicap reserved day tenting, **you must provide a VALID Handicapped Parking Placard, Proof of registration (Placard # with photo ID) must be provided at set up. The charge for this is \$25.00.** Non-reserved handicap benching will also be provided.

**Obedience & Rally-O day tenting is not reserved, this area is by the Rally-O and Obedience rings.**

**Set up will begin on Wednesday after the rings are set up.**

**No exhibitor vehicle parking or driving on the field or surrounding berms. This will be strictly enforced. We will supply a shuttle service to get your equipment on and off the field.**

## GENERAL INFORMATION

1. ENTRY FEES SHALL NOT BE REFUNDED AFTER THE CLOSING DATE in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by Veterinarian or Judge, or barred from competition by action of Show Committee, or because it has been entered incorrectly. If because of riot, civil disturbance, or other acts beyond the control of the Club, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry will be made.
2. ENTRY FEES WILL BE REFUNDED WHEN A BITCH ENTERED IN OBEDIENCE COMES INTO SEASON after entry of the bitch has been submitted if a Veterinarians certificate, certifying that the bitch was in season within the ten day period preceding the trial, is delivered to the Show Secretary on or before the date of the trial.
3. ENTRIES WILL BE ACKNOWLEDGED AFTER CLOSING DATE. Receipts, judging schedules, and exhibitors passes will be e-mailed
4. ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON LEASH WHILE ON THE GROUNDS. You are responsible for cleaning up if you permit your dog to relieve itself outside the show building. Failure to do so may result in being expelled from the building for one day's showing by the Superintendent.
5. All empty rings are to be kept free of dogs.
6. SHOW PRECINCTS: Whitemud Equine Learning Centre Assoc., excluding the commercial booth space.
7. "ALL DOGS MUST BE KEPT UNDER CONTROL AT ALL TIMES." If not in competition the dog must wear a collar and be on leash a maximum of six (6) feet or appropriately confined in the benching area.
8. 19.7 It shall be the duty and obligation of the show-giving club to see that a judge, club official, volunteer, or any participant at an event held under these rules is not subject to indignities. The Conformation Show Committee Chair shall promptly report to the CKC any infringement of this regulation, and the Discipline Committee shall have the authority to take such action as it deems fit on receipt of a report indicating that this has occurred. A copy of this regulation shall be prominently placed in every premium list and catalogue.

## CHAMPIONS AND CHAMPIONSHIP POINTS

Section 1. A dog awarded WINNERS at a championship show held under these Show Rules shall be credited with a number of championship points (ranging from 0 to 5) and the determination of the number of championship points to be credited to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be provided hereunder.

Section 2. The schedule to be employed in the determination of the number of points to be allocated to a dog awarded WINNERS shall be as follows:

Dogs competing*	1	2	3 to 5	6 to 9	10 to 12	13 or more
Points allocated	0	1	2	3	4	5

\* includes the dog awarded Winners

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall be **not** in the calculation for championship points.

To determine the number of championship points earned by a dog awarded WINNERS, total all the dogs in competition which the dog defeated directly or indirectly, for the highest of the following official breed awards: Winners, Best of Winners, Best of Breed or Best of Opposite Sex and then consult the schedule as set forth above.

The new system provides for additional points, provided that the dog has defeated another dog, either at the breed level or at the group level, if a dog awarded WINNERS also placed in the Group, as listed hereunder.

A class dog awarded Best In Show at an all-breed championship show will be credited with five points, inclusive of any points earned at the breed or group level. In no case may a dog earn more than 5 points at any single show.

## Grand Champion (GCh) Point Schedule

The title of Grand Champion may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation championship. Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the conformation championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the conformation championship. To be awarded a Grand Champion title, a dog must attain a minimum of 20 points, which must include a minimum of two (2) wins of at least two (2) points each. Points may be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

(a) Grand Champion Point System Points towards the Grand Champion title, at breed level, are awarded to the Best of Breed, Best of Opposite Sex, Select Dog and Select Bitch. Points are calculated based on the number of animals competing at the breed level for the Best of Breed winner and the number of similar-sex dogs competing for the other three (Best of Opposite, Select Dog, Select Bitch). The following schedule shall be employed in the determination of points awarded at breed level

(b) In order to obtain a Grand Champion title, a dog must obtain at least two (2) points after 12 months of age.

In counting the number of eligible dogs in competition, a dog that is disqualified, dismissed, excused or ordered from the ring by the judge shall not be included in the calculation for Grand Champion points.

15.2.4 GRAND CHAMPION BRONZE (GChB) The title of Grand Champion Bronze may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion is attained. a. Points for this title are only accumulated after the completion of the Grand Championship and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand championship. b. To be awarded a Grand Champion Bronze title, a dog must attain a minimum of 50 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward. c. Points accumulated prior to July 1, 2021 may be used to attain the GChB title, however, a minimum of five (5) points must be earned after July 1, 2021.

15.2.5 GRAND CHAMPION SILVER (GChS) a. The title of Grand Champion Silver may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Bronze is attained and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Bronze. b. To be awarded a Grand Champion Silver title, a dog must attain a minimum of 100 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.2.6 GRAND CHAMPION GOLD (GChG) a. The title of Grand Champion Gold may only be earned after the completion of the CKC conformation title Grand Champion Silver is attained and do not include the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver. b. To be awarded a Grand Champion Gold title, a dog must attain a minimum of 200 points, which must include a minimum of two wins of at least two (2) points each. Points must be gained at breed, group or Best in Show/Specialty level. Only the highest points earned at a single show are carried forward.

15.3 GRAND CHAMPION EXCELLENT (GCh.Ex) 15.3.1 The title of Grand Champion Excellent may only be earned after the completion of the CKC Grand Champion Silver title. Exhibitors will be required to submit to Shows & Trials the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet documenting the additional requirements. The Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet Form is located on the CKC website. the points earned in attaining the Grand Championship Silver.

15.3.2 To earn the title a dog must have earned the following during their career as a Special:

- a. one (1) Best in Show or a Best of Breed at a breed National specialty (where a minimum of 10 dogs have competed).
- b. three (3) Group 1st, or three (3) breed specialty Best of Breed wins.
- c. a CKC performance title from any CKC event. Titles excluded are: CGN, Herding Novice Tested Certificate, all Instinct titles from all events, as well as all Sprinter titles and all Chase Ability Program titles.

15.3.3 Best in Show, Best of Breed at a National Specialty, 3 Group wins, or 3 Specialty Best of Breed wins, must be attained after the completion of a regular championship. The performance Title may be attained at any time in the dog's career.

NOTE: 1. Exhibitors are required to complete the Grand Champion Excellent Record Sheet form located on the CKC website and forward it to CKC upon completion of requirements above. 2. Grandfathering of the previous version of the Grand Champion Excellent title will be honored up until July 1, 2022.

### **Non-Member Participation Fee**

**24-12-3.** Non-member participation fee

- a) An annual non-member participation fee for awards and titles will be charged to a Canadian non-member of CKC. The fee will match the ERN fee.
- b) In order to protect the awards/titles earned, the non-member will have a choice either to become a CKC member or to pay the non-member participation fee. Failure to comply within 30 days of notification will cause all awards and titles to be cancelled.
- c) The Premium List must carry a note stating that "these fees apply only to dogs wholly owned by non-CKC members and are not applicable to CKC members

## **EKC COVID-19 INFORMATION**

No dog may be brought onto the grounds or premises of the Edmonton Kennel Club Show & Trials if it:

- Is known to have distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or other communicable disease.
- Has recovered from distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or any other communicable disease within the last 30 days (prior to event)
- Has been housed within 30 days prior to the event on premises on which there existed distemper, parvovirus, kennel cough or any other communicable disease.
- The Edmonton Kennel Club has the right to remove a dog from the event premises and the exhibitor may be subject to disciplinary action if it is found that CKC rules have been contravened.

If any club members, volunteers, ring stewards, judges or fellow exhibitors are subject to abusive language or behavior, or if you fail to abide by the show protocols, this may result in your dismissal from the show with no right of entry refund.
